BY THE NUMBERS

.867 – ACC teams went 52-8 against non-conference opponents in 2014, including 18 wins over teams ranked in the Brine Media poll. The .867 winning percentage is the highest since 2010 and second best of this century.

1 - An ACC team has held the No. 1 spot in both the media and coaches poll six weeks this season. All six teams are among the top 10 in both final regular season polls.

2 - With back-to-back NCAA titles, Duke is only the eighth program to repeat as the NCAA Champion and first since Syracuse did in 2008 and 2009.

3 - The all-ACC NCAA final marked the third time in NCAA history two ACC teams played for the national championship (2014, 2010 and 1986).

4 - Duke's Jordan Wolf and Maryland's Niko Amato collected All-ACC honors for the fourth times of their careers in 2014, joining only five other former ACC greats as four-time selections.

4 - Four of the last five national championship games have been between two current ACC men's lacrosse teams.

5 - Including 2014, the ACC has won both the men's and women's lacrosse titles in the same year on five occasions (2014, 2013, 2010, 1991 and 1986).

5 - Only nine programs have won the national title in history, and five of those nine are currently in the ACC (Duke, Maryland, North Carolina, Syracuse, Virginia).

6 - All six ACC teams (league record) earned berths in the NCAA Championship, while five of the six were among the top eight seeds.

8 - With Duke and Notre Dame meeting for the NCAA Championship, it was the fifth straight year the ACC is represented by at least one team in the national championship game. Current ACC membership combines for 48 appearances in the national championship game

18 - The ACC earned 18 wins over ranked non-league opponents, including eight wins over top-10 competition.

20 - The ACC had 20 players selected in the 2014 Major League Lacrosse Collegiate Draft, including three first-round picks.

24 - The ACC's six teams combine for 24 NCAA titles, 46 appearances in the national championship game and 96 appearances in the national semifinals.



DUKE REPEATS AS NCAA CHAMPION

BALTIMORE, Md. - Senior attackman Jordan Wolf tallied two goals and four assists and the Blue Devil defense held off a fourth quarter charge by Notre Dame en route to the program's second consecutive NCAA Men's Lacrosse National Championship with an 11-9 victory over the Irish. The national championship is the third for the Blue Devil program in the past five seasons.

Under the direction of head coach John Danowski, Duke became the first team to win back-to-back titles since Syracuse accomplished the feat in 2008 and 2009. Wolf was named the NCAA Championship Most Outstanding Player. Deemer Class, Will Haus, Myles Jones, Kyle Keenan and Henry Lobb joined him on the NCAA All-Tournament Team.

Wolf, who had a hand in each of the Blue Devils' final five goals, led all scorers in the contest with six points. Junior Kyle Keenan and sophomores Deemer Class and Myles Jones also had two goals apiece while senior Brendan Fowler went 13-of-22 at the faceoff X to help seal the win.

With Duke leading 8-2 midway through the third quarter, Notre Dame put together a 6-2 run to narrow the margin to one with five minutes on the clock. Brendan Fowler won the ensuing faceoff, but Irish goaltender Conor Kelly made the save and Notre Dame cleared for a chance to tie the game.

The Irish got a look at goal, but Duke's Luke Aaron made the stop and Jones picked up the ground ball. Looking to stop Notre Dame's momentum, Wolf found Keenan on the crease for the junior attackman's second and most important goal of the game that put Duke ahead 10-8 with 2:39 to play.

A goal by Sergio Perkovic of the Irish made it a one-goal game at 10-9 with just 49 seconds left on the clock, but Brendan Fowler won the ensuing faceoff for

the Blue Devils and Wolf beat a pair of Notre Dame defenders to get the open net goal and send Duke to its second consecutive title.

Fowler won 13-of-22 faceoffs and picked up six ground balls for the Blue Devils, while Chris Hipps and Lobb recorded two caused turnovers apiece. Lobb held Notre Dame single-season scoring leader Matt Kavanagh to just two goals and one assist and only four shots on the day after he recorded seven in the semifinal against Maryland.

Aaron posted nine saves in the victory and had one ground ball to finish the year 15-3. Kelly made 12 stops for the Irish.

NOTRE DAME WINS 2014 ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

CHESTER, Pa. - Notre Dame went on a 6-0 run in the third quarter and held on to defeat Syracuse, 15-14, to win the 2014 ACC Men's Lacrosse Championship Sunday afternoon at PPL Park.

Matt Kavanagh, the Tournament's Most Valuable Player, led the Irish with four goals and two assists, including back-to-back goals in the pivotal third quarter.

Jim Marlatt tallied three goals and one assist for Notre Dame, while Conor Doyle had a career-high five points.

Irish goalkeeper Conor Kelly finished with seven saves, including stopping Syracuse's Kevin Rice with four seconds remaining to clinch the league title.

After the Irish jumped out to a 3-1 lead in the first quarter, Syracuse went on a 5-0 run to take a 6-3 lead. Notre Dame scored four of the last five goals of the first half to send the game to the break tied at 7-7.

Syracuse converted on an extra-man opportunity to start the second half. Notre Dame then scored six goals and held the Orange scoreless for over 13 minutes to take a 13-8 lead.

Trailing 15-10 with under ten minutes remaining in the game, Syracuse scored four straight down the stretch to pull within one. The Orange had the ball with the chance to send the game to overtime but were unable to get the ball past Notre Dame's Kelly. Syracuse's Chris Daddio won 21-of-33 faceoffs, including eight of the first nine in the game. Nick Ossello went 10-of-25 and tied a career high with three points.

Rice, who had six assists and seven points for the Orange in the championship, set new tournament

records with 15 points and 11 assists on the weekend. Randy Staats tied a career high with five goals against Notre Dame.

Both teams converted on two extra-man opportunities. Notre Dame was a perfect 2-for-2 with the advantage, while Syracuse went 2-for-3.

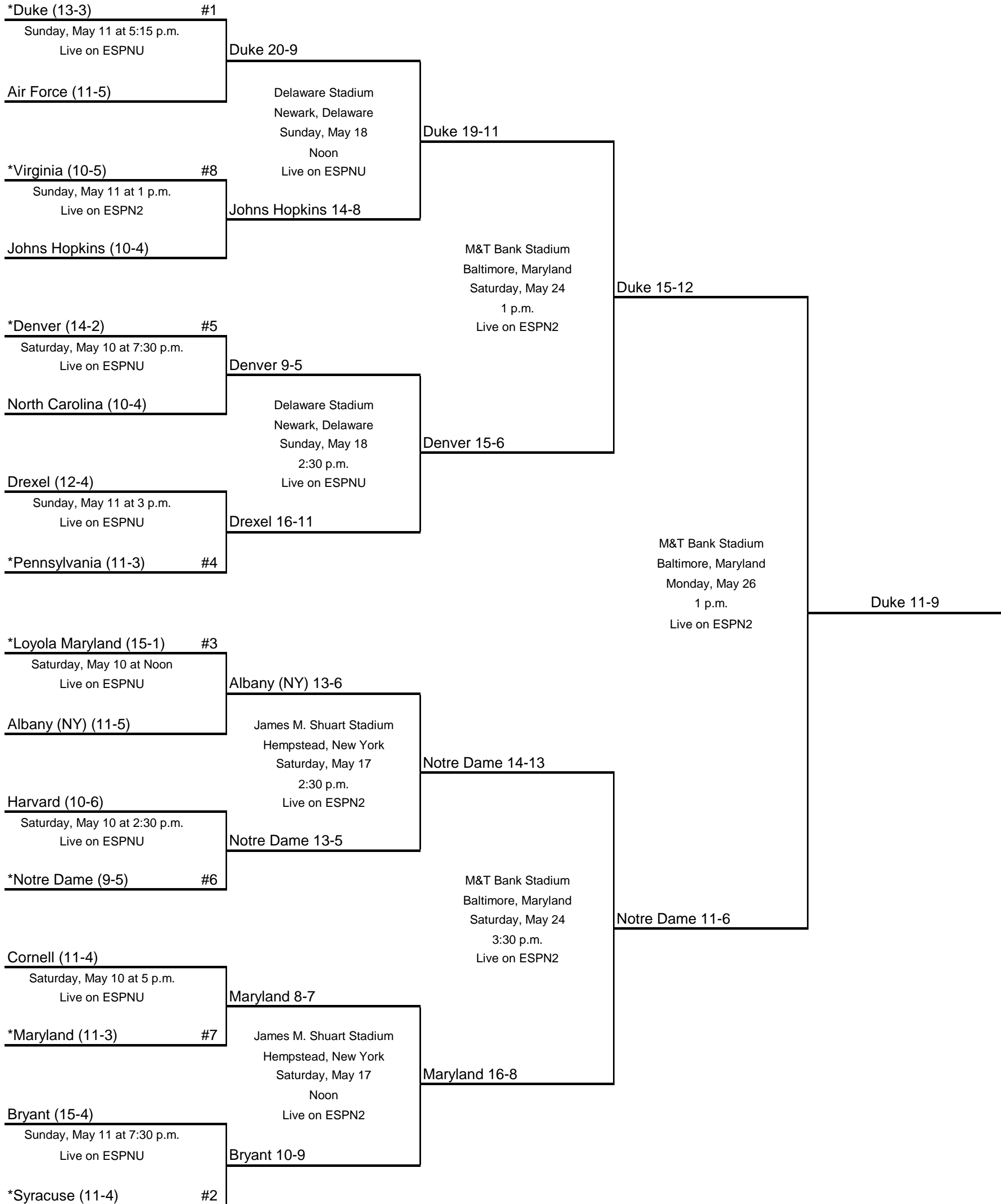
